Unusual Fire and Hazardous Combustion and Decomposition Products: Smoke, soot, and toxic/irritating fumes (i.e., carbon dioxide, carbon monoxide, etc.). Oxides of nitrogen and carbon.

Fire and Explosion Hazards: May liberate irritating or toxic vapors during combustion or decomposition.

Extinguishing Media: Based on the NFPA guide, use dry chemical, carbon dioxide, water mist, water jet sprays, halogen, or alcohol foam suitable for Class B fires. Use water to cool containers exposed to fire. For large fires, use water spray, fog or alcohol foam, thoroughly drenching the burning material.

Containment & Recovery of Product: Contain with absorbent material, such as clay, soil, universal binding medium, or any commercially available absorbent. Shovel reclaimed dye and absorbent into a recovery or salvage drums for disposal. For larger spills, transfer to a salvage tank for recovery or safe disposal. Any residues should be treated like a small spill. This is not a RCRA hazardous waste per Title 40 CFR 261. Stop material from contaminating soil, or from entering sewers or bodies of water. For larger spills, transfer to a salvage tank for safe recovery/disposal. Residues are treated as small spills.
